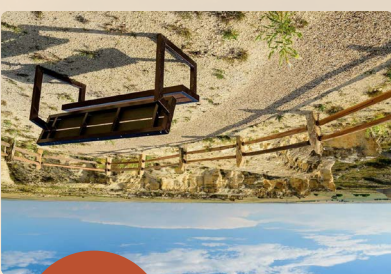
Little Jerusalem Badlands State Park

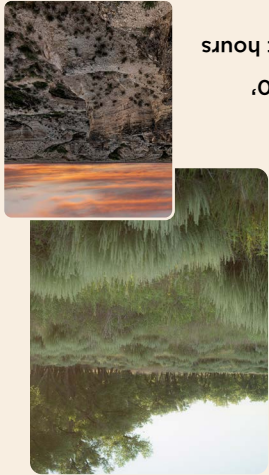

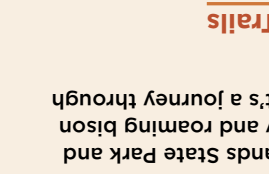

Oakley proudly honors the "Birthplace of the Legend" of Buffalo Bill with a striking twice-life-size bronze sculpture commemorating the 1868 contest where William F. Cody earned his famous title "Buffalo Bill". Visitors can explore the Cultural Center for travel information, Kansas maps, and brochures, then shop at the gift shop for local Kansas-made souvenirs. 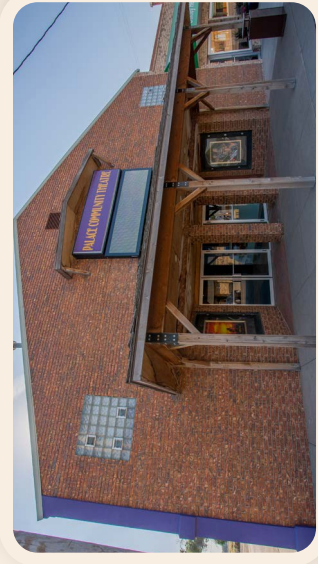
Oakley Municipal Pool
